What a season Bluejays battle their way to Class C state runner-up finish

sk any fan, coach or player, there's no denying that **Guardian Angels Central** Catholic left everything they had on the field in the Class C state softball championship game at Hastings.

The Bluejays competed with the heart of a champion, and played with a tremendous amount of energy every single play. The will to win was there. Unfortunately, only one team could come out on top.

And after a second championship game, it was Fairbury who captured the Class C championship

title with a 6-5 win over Guardian Angels Central Catholic.

"These were the two best teams by far, I absolutely believe that. That final game could have gone either way," Bluejay head coach Allan Kreikemeier said. "It was really close as to who the number one team was, but Fairbury got it done, so hats off to them."

With the loss, GACC finished as the Class C state runner-up. The Buejays closed out a successful season as they compiled a 29-5 record.

"We just wanted these girls to

fight until the end. Our kids just kept responding and responding," Kreikemeier said. "You try to get every ounce of effort from your players, and I think we got real close."

This marked the ninth consecutive season that the Bluejays have competed in the state softball tournament. GACC made its first appearance in 2011.

"It's a great feeling. That's just work ethic from these kids.' Kreikemeier said. "It's been really fun to watch these girls get better."

Hass said after a few hours and getting in touch with Kreikemeier, the year had been corrected and he was officially announced as a finalist.

"It's an honor to be a part of this," Hass said. "I have a new air of confidence almost. Something like this takes all four years of high school to achieve, so it's nice to be recognized for the work I've done over my four years."

acts and music.

"It's awesome, and it's what high school is all about," Hass said. "This is one of the only times in your life you get to be involved in all these different activities. I knew I didn't want to regret anything through high school, so I made sure I did everything."

Kreikemeier said Hass' wide range of involvements around town made him a great candidate for nomination.

"The school looks at student involvement in activities, service to the community, and GPA when nominating a student for Believers and Achievers," Kreikemeier said. "Noah is involved in everything from football to the musical, he does a large amount of volunteer work and his GPA and ACT score are both very high. He is incredibly deserving of this award."

Kreikemeier said this kind of

recognition can help a students scholarship opportunities in the long run.

"This is a huge honor for any student," Kreikemeier said. "Only 48 students across the state are recognized. Eight of those students will receive scholarships, but even if a student is not in that group, odds are he or she will receive other scholarships based on how achieving they are."

Those eight students will be granted a \$500 scholarship for their future college education at a year-end banquet for all of the finalists.

To qualify for the award, students must first be nominated by a member of their school's faculty, and be involved in one or more NSAA sanctioned activities.

Along with that, students must maintain a GPA of 3.75 on an unweighted 4.00 scale, with other academic honors and awards also considered.

Dec. 6 deadline for alumni scholarship

The Louis and Abby Faye Dinklage Foundation of Wisner will make available a number of \$1000 scholarships for alumni of Guardian Angels Central Catholic High School who are fulltime college students.

An application form is required for this scholarship even if you have received it in previous years. These scholarships may be applied to vocational training programs or a bachelor degree program where you are enrolled full-time.

The completed application form must be submitted to the school counselor's office on or before December 6.
