Bluejays brush off early upset, capture Class C state title



The Bluejays were dealt a stunning loss in the opening round of the state tournament, but their mission never changed.

Facing elimination every step of the way, GACC settled in and reeled off six consecutive wins to accomplish its season-long goal. A state championship.

Guardian Angels Central Catholic secured the Class C State Softball title with a pair of wins, 7-3 and 12-0, over Kearney Catholic in

the state finals.

"No matter what happened, we were going to leave everything we had on the field, and these kids did that," Bluejay head coach Allan Kreikemeier said. "It's so special to see them achieve a goal like this."

Playing their way through the elimination bracket, GACC needed two wins in the Class C state finals.

GACC ends the year with a 29-3 record. This marked the final game for four seniors: Jenna Schinstock, Brenna Rief, Avery Kreikemeier and Erin Franzluebbers.
