Svec will always remember relationships

Mark Svec is an avid golfer. Just ask his wife, Barb.

"Well, we'll see him again in October," Mark said in reference to what his wife would tell their two dogs once golf season rolled around each year.

While golfing was in Svec's blood, coaching was not. That, however, changed in the early 2000's.

The idea of coaching had been planted in Mark's mind from parents at GACC High School. After some initial resistance, Svec attended a three-day golf school, which helped open the door to coaching.

After coaching in the Bluejay golf program since 2004, that door is now closing as Svec is retiring as the GACC golf coach.

"It's been an enjoyable and rewarding experience," Svec said. "What I will remember most is the relationships with the kids."

Some of the strongest bonds were created at the state golf tournament.

"From 2009 to now, we were lucky enough to have teams or individuals qualify [for state] every year," Svec said. "And that's where you really get to know the kids, when you're with them for three days in a row."

In the Svec era, Henry Knobbe was his first-ever state qualifier. Mark also had five state medalists: Ben Eilerts (twice), Isaac Kreikemeier, Cody Steuter, Hannah Hunke and Andrew Franzluebbers (twice).

Steuter and Franzluebbers were the only four-time state qualifiers in program history.

One of the biggest accolades during the Svec-coached years was crowning the program's lone state champion, Ben Eilerts, in 2011. That year, the Bluejays finished 3rd in Class D.

Ben Eilerts is the son of Mike Eilerts, who is also stepping away

from the GACC boys golf program. He served as Svec's assistant coach the past four seasons.

For Svec, his fellow coaches, Duane Mendlik, Daryl Boots and Eilerts, meant the world to him.

"I will never forget my relationships with Duane, Daryl and Mike, and what quality people they were," Svec said.

Svec served as assistant coach for Mendlik from 2004 to 2006.

"I learned more about kids from Duane, and how to manage personalities, in three years with him than I ever would have on my own," Svec said. In 2007 with Boots, Svec maintained the assistant coach title but handled the head coaching duties. Then in 2019, Svec officially became the head coach.

"I couldn't have done this without my three coaches," Svec said.

Svec also noted he couldn't have coached without the support of his bosses at CharterWest Bank in West Point.

"They told us we needed to get involved with something in the community, and we'll support you. This was my way to be involved," Svec said. "I couldn't have done this without their support. They allowed me to do this."

Support from parents in the

program was also huge. It was a driving force to allowing Bluejay golf flourish.

"We have some great kids in our school system. Parents [at GACC] do a really great job raising great kids," Svec said. "They are young men and women their parents can be proud of."

At GACC's end-of-the-year athletic banquet, Svec's message to golf parents, past and present, was:

"It has been an honor and a privilege to have been entrusted with your kids. I've never taken that trust for granted. I've gotten a lot more in return from your kids than I ever gave them."




